GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION, MAY 2018

Is your governing board ready to implement the new Regulations?

This EU legislation is also in the process of receiving Royal Assent. It will determine how peoples' personal data is collected, used and stored safely.

Schools have worked within the Data Protection Act 1998 and therefore many strategies and procedures will simply need to be strengthened in order to be GDPR compliant.

Your school or MAT will be the official data controller and as governors you therefore need to ensure the school/ MAT complies with the law.

- Privacy Notices set out the detail of how the school will process personal data.
- Consent parents will sign on behalf of their children, though from age 13 children can sign for themselves. Forms will need to be specific and written in an easily understandable way.
- Protection for children's personal data has been strengthened and governors will need to think about whether parental consent will be required

for in-class apps.

- Data breaches where an individual is likely to suffer damage must be notified to the ICO within 72 hours.
- Data Protection Officer have you a nominated individual? Are you sharing costs with other schools?

Actions and on-going scrutiny

- Add GDPR to a designated committee Terms of Reference and Agenda.
- Review progress of the school's GDPR Action Plan.
- Review the school's Risk Register and report to the Full Governing Board each term.

SECONDARY SCHOOLS CAREEERS EDUCATION AND GUIDANCE

As from January 2018, new statutory guidance and duties were published for secondary schools.

Careers information, advice and guidance needs to be included in the curriculum as from Year 8.

As from 2 January 2018, the school website must now include a Careers Statement.

This should include how curriculum provision has been made for independent careers advice for Years 8-13.

Students should receive education and training provider information about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships.

Does your Careers Curriculum Leader use the Gatsby benchmark when planning the curriculum?

No Leader for Careers? You will need one by September 2018.

Do you have a governor able to take a strategic interest in careers education? How will governors monitor?

STOP PRESS: The DfE have now published details about the range of T-Level qualifications for 16-19 year olds. Technical studies will combine with work based learning and apprenticeships. All existing vocational qualifications will cease and be replaced with T-Levels as from 2020.

The DfE has updated their service for governor recruitment and will match individuals with an interest in becoming a governor with school vacancies. <u>Inspiring Governance</u>

The Governance Handbook is quite clear about getting the right people around the table and states "The effectiveness of a board depends on the quality of its people and how they work together and with executive leaders."

How up to date is your skills audit? This will enable you to specify the skills your Board is looking for.

Our Clerks have reported on several successful placements this year, so why not register your interest with Inspiring Governance?

If your school had previously registered with the Schools One Stop Shop for Governors, this is now called Governors for Schools and it is likely you will be contacted to confirm willingness for your data to be transferred.



SCHOOL PERFORMANCE

The DfE has issued league tables for secondary school performance for 2017. Ofsted has issued ISDR (Interpreting Data Summary Report) which covers all Key Stages and includes absence, exclusions and destinations data.

Questions to consider:

How does your school compare with similar schools?

Does your school development plan identify key priorities from the SEF or latest Ofsted judgement?

How well are disadvantaged groups performing and what is the impact of Pupil Premium funding on the progress and achievement of those children?

What about more able learners, are they maintaining an upward trajectory from their starting points?

Do you have a link governor to monitor progress?





Analysing School Performance How is your school getting to grips with ASP?

School Admissions As schools review their applications for admission 2018/19, it is worth remembering that Looked After Children have the highest priority for admissions; this has been now been extended to include adopted children who had previously been Looked After.

Professional Clerking All our Clerks will be undertaking the DfE Professional Clerk Award during the summer term. Your school may be asked to support a Clerk's application

Balancing the budget becomes tougher at each Finance Committee. The DfE's Schools Commercial Team has introduced several initiatives to make school procurement robust,

Complaints Policy How up to date is your policy and does it address persistent and vexatious complainants? Governors should not engage with complainants other than to direct them to the school's policy; you may be required for a governors panel hearing.

PRIMARY SCIENCE CURRICULUM

Has your school been selected to take part in the KS2 science testing later this term?

What have governors been told about the preparation for this testing?

Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Schools in a speech at the beginning of the year suggested a lack of stimulating science lessons through primary school may play a part in the decreasing uptake at KS4 and KS5 examinations.

Would Ofsted find evidence of fun and motivating science lessons at all key stages?

Wow moments where children are given the time to finish practical tasks in order to consolidate learning?

How do you know? What about a link governor visit?

"To be clear, I am not complacent about curriculum narrowing and the squeezing out of science in primary. On the contrary, our renewed focus on the curriculum is intended to address these very issues, and we will be looking in depth at science curriculum in primary in phase two of our research. And this will feed into the way we address curriculum in the new inspection framework for 2019."

SAFEGUARDING AND CHILD PROTECTION

The most recent Keeping Children Safe consultation has now closed and an update to the Guidance is expected soon.

New advice was issued in December 2017 regarding Sexual Violence and Sexual Harassment Between Children in Schools and Colleges.

This document provides useful guidance:

- \Rightarrow What the terms mean.
- ⇒ Schools' legal responsibilities.
- ⇒ Whole school approach to safeguarding and child protection.

⇒ How to respond to reports of sexual violence/ sexual harassment between children in schools or colleges.

The DfE and Department for Health jointly issued a consultation document *Transforming children's and young peoples' mental health provision.*

Your schools will have raised their concerns with governors and discussed the strategies already in place. Hopefully, the outcome of the consultation will have a positive impact by improving provision and support for the children in our care.
